Through film and scene critique, students will research and share their findings, discovering how specific character's trials and triumphs align (or not) with their own belief systems and/or moments of adversity.

Together, we will learn how the history and enduring legacy of Disney captured even more hearts with its Pixar expansion and additional character development and storylines. This class will examine how popular characters from both have strengthened one another's legacy. This class will also continue to explore the cultural and historical impact that Disney and Pixar's characters have had by challenging students to think critically, apply research skills and present content on a weekly basis.
